## Prevail Bank Contributes \$20,000 to Mill Pond Park Renovation

**(Owen, WI)** – Prevail Bank has donated \$20,000 to the City of Owen to support the renovation of Mill Pond Park, a highly used community gathering space that will soon receive significant upgrades.

The renovation project includes the installation of new playground equipment designed to be inclusive and accessible for children of all abilities, along with a durable rubber mulch ground cover to enhance safety.

“The playground at Mill Pond Park has served our community well for more than two decades, but it’s showing its age,” said Mayor Scott Jalling. “This generous donation from Prevail Bank moves us much closer to making the park a safer and more enjoyable place for families. We’re truly grateful for their support.”



Mill Pond Park, located on County Road X in the heart of Owen, hosts a wide range of community activities throughout the year, including the Owen Junior Fair, Farmers Market, fishing contests, and numerous private gatherings.

“At Prevail, we believe vibrant communities are built when we invest in them,” said Nathan Quinnell, President/CEO of Prevail Bank. “We’re proud to help create a refreshed, inclusive space that local families can enjoy for years to come.”

While Prevail Bank’s contribution represents a major portion of the project costs, additional funds are still needed for installation and ground-cover materials. The City is planning fundraising events to help close the remaining gap.

A formal ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held once the project is complete, at which time the park will be officially renamed “**Prevail Park.**”
