Prevail Bank Shred Event Helps Catkins Animal Rescue with \$1,440 Donation

(Phillips) Turning paper into something powerful, Prevail Bank's Community Shred Day in Phillips raised \$1,440 for Catkins Animal Rescue, an organization that helps animals in need throughout the Northwoods region.

Prevail Bank pledged to donate \$1 for every pound of paper shredded, up to \$1,000—and the community rose to the challenge, bringing in 2,800 pounds of documents to be safely destroyed and recycled. True to its pledge, Prevail Bank gifted \$1,000; the public donated an additional \$440. (\$230 of the \$440 was handed to Prevail to pass along.)
