Prevail Bank Shred Event Helps Families in Crisis with \$1,190 Donation

(Stevens Point, WI) Turning paper into something powerful, Prevail Bank's Community Shred Day in Stevens Point raised \$1,190 for <u>CAP</u> <u>Services</u>' Family Crisis Center, supporting families in need throughout the area.

Prevail Bank pledged to donate \$1 for every pound of paper shredded, up to \$1,000—and the community rose to



the challenge, bringing in 1,500 pounds of documents to be safely destroyed and recycled. True to its pledge, Prevail Bank gifted \$1,000; the public donated an additional \$190.

A special check presentation was held at Prevail Bank's Stevens Point branch.
