Prevail Bank Shred Event Helps Animals in Crisis with \$1,412 Donation

Turning paper into something powerful, Prevail Bank's Community Shred Day in Wausau raised \$1,412 for the <u>Humane Society of Marathon County</u>, supporting the end of animal suffering throughout the area.

Prevail Bank pledged to donate \$1 for every pound of paper shredded, up to \$1,000—and the community rose to the challenge, bringing in 2,300 pounds of documents to be safely destroyed and recycled. True to its pledge, Prevail Bank gifted \$1,000; the public donated an additional \$412.
