Saving the local environment. Prevail collects & shreds 9 tons of paper.

Prevail Bank is a community bank that takes seriously its vision of making a lasting, meaningful, and positive impact. This year, as a result of its free community shred days held at each of its nine branches, nearly 9 tons of paper (17,887 lbs.) was collected and shredded, saving 151 trees.

"Sustainability and building a better tomorrow for our customers and the next generation are important to us," said Nathan Quinnell, Prevail Bank President. "Working together to pursue what's possible is what Prevail Bank does best."

In addition to bolstering the environment, \$11,387 was divided between nine local nonprofits: United Way of South Wood & Adams County (Wisconsin Rapids), Friends of the Old School (Owen-Withee), Children's Miracle Network (Marshfield), People Helping People / Adopt a Veteran Program (Baraboo), Humane Society of Marathon County (Wausau), Operation Horses Heal (Medford), YMCA of the Chippewa Valley (Eau Claire), Catkins Animal Rescue (Phillips), and CAP Services / Women & Children's Shelter (Stevens Point). Prevail Bank

donated a dollar for every pound of paper collected, up to \$1,000 per location. Ultimately, Prevail Bank gifted \$8,597; the public donated an additional \$2,790.
