At Prevail Bank Shredded Documents Equate to Cash

Prevail Bank has coordinated nine free shred days for paper documents during the months of April and May. For every pound of paper shredded, Prevail Bank will donate a dollar, up to \$1,000 to a nonprofit. If every branch shreds at least 1,000 pounds, Prevail Bank will be donating a total of \$9,000!

From an identity theft perspective, shredding confidential information is very important. According to Experian, identity theft affects about 1 in 20 Americans each year, and it's rising rapidly. During the 2020 holidays, 24% of 1,000 surveyed respondents reported being a victim of identity theft or fraud – double the percentage from 2019! Identity theft occurs when another person takes pieces of your personal information and assumes it as their own, thereby causing damage to your credit, as well as your name. Credit monitoring and identity theft restoration services do exist. For more information, every Prevail Bank location has ID TheftSmart brochures to share.
